# You now have until 1 January 2023 to adopt the UKCA marking



## Responded to feedback

Businesses continue to face challenges from the pandemic which has made preparation for the UKCA marking more difficult. We are extending the current standstill arrangement for the UKCA marking for most goods for a further year.



## Extended standstill

We will extend standstill arrangements for all manufactured goods (except medical devices) until 31 December 2022. UKCA marking will then be compulsory to place goods on the GB market.



## Continuing preparations

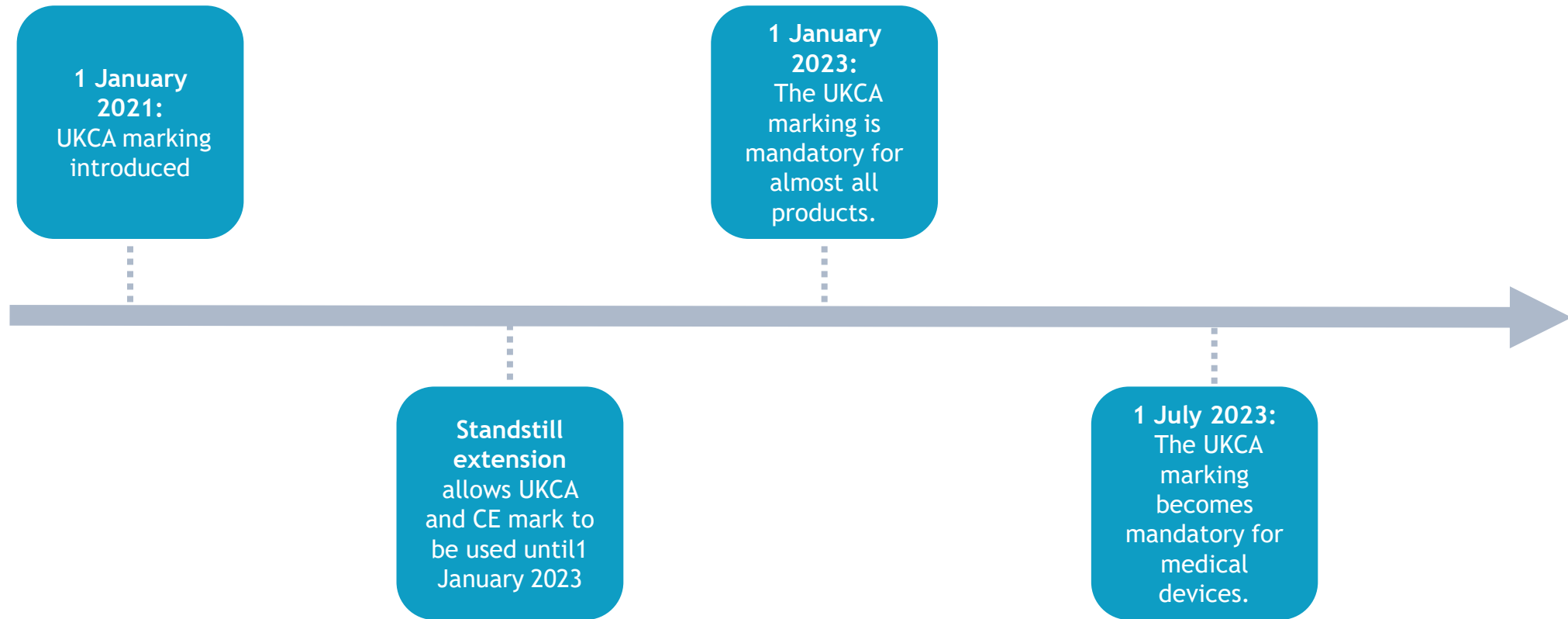
We will use this extension to continue supporting industry. We are working to increase UK and overseas preparedness through more detailed engagement and support. We also will work closely with CABs to increase capacity.



# Key Dates



The extension brings the standstill end dates for the majority of product types which require the UKCA marking into line, with the exception of medical devices.



# All other UKCA requirements are the same



Products that previously required CE marking, and also aerosol products, will still need to use UKCA to be sold in GB.



Businesses will still need to use a UK approved body if their product requires third party testing.



The responsibility of the importer to apply their address to the product by 1 January 2023 is still required.



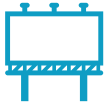
The requirements for placing products on the NI market are unchanged using either the CE marking or a combination of UKNI and CE.

# There are four key messages for businesses



1 January 2023 is the final deadline for UKCA compliance and there will not be a further extension. Businesses should take action now to be ready in time.



If using third party conformity assessment businesses should begin this process as soon as possible with an approved body.



Businesses should consult our GOV.UK guidance which is regularly updated and also make use of our readiness products.
