The internship must be part of the studies of a student completing a degree at a university of applied sciences, and they must earn credits for it. For this reason, students who have already completed their internship or graduated, graduates or students pursuing a higher degree at a university of applied sciences or in an open university of applied sciences cannot be accepted as recipients of the internship grant. It is important that the studies progress during the internship.

Additionally, the intern may be eligible to receive support from their university's internship program, if available.
